Issue Statement:

Large groups of people targeting communication to one person can be used as a tool for activism and civic engagement. However, it is also used as a tactic to harass or potentially harm people. We are trying to develop a policy framework that protects people from mass harassment and intimidation without penalizing people engaging in legitimate forms of communication.

Research

Key Points:

- While brigading and mass harassment are well defined as concepts, we lack a broadly accepted method of detecting or measuring brigading when it occurs.
- Research suggests that many people think coordinated brigading should not be allowed in certain contexts, but some groups are relatively more permissive.

External Engagement

Key Points:

- Stakeholders agreed that coordinated attacks could have more far-reaching consequences on victims than organic harassment. However, some pointed out that it would be challenging for FB to differentiate between the two - networked behavior does not exclude organic behavior and vice versa.
- While a majority agreed that it would be appropriate to give vulnerable individuals greater protections from brigading, there were differences in stakeholders' interpretations of what constitutes a vulnerable individual.
